This morning I fished with Anthony Ng who wanted his daughter to catch a citation drum, it took about 10 minutes to get the bite.....but it wasn't a citation, 39 3/4 inches.

Also on the boat were Jerry Dilsaver with the NC Sportsman and Rick Burnley with Saltwater Sportsman. Rick needed a cover shot for an upcoming story, but a 39 incher wasn't going to do it. We never had another bite all morning.

Rick stayed over to fish the afternoon bite. To be sure we'd get a bigger fish. We never had a bite. That's right, I got the big SKUNK. I can't find where Greg put the bananas on the boat.

Meanwhile, Greg was getting "his" and Derek Jordan caught 15. It was kind of like the gool ol days when DJ or Rick Cayton were beating up on me with double headers.

I'm glad that I've got my afternoon crowd in the morning......if they show up.

I had a little engine trouble over the weekend, but the pit crew at Morehead Marine will have me running tomorrow. In the meantime, Greg, Ray and Brian have been holding down the fort. All in all it's been tough fishing, blame it on the heat. A few big drum, few pups, Greg did catch 37 trout yesterday and him and Ray found the tarpon up the river in the afternoon.....mixed in with the big drum.

I took the skiff for a half day this morning, caught some live shrimp and had a bang up morning. A dozen speks, 5 nice black drum, a keeper striper and our 2 keeper pups. We also managed to catch a dozen croakers and bluefish which we turned into a 125 pound tarpon and a 40 pound drum.....all before 11 am. Not a bad half day.
